

# INARY MOURNS 1964 DEATH OF MR. ELWOOD HEINBACH

Mr. Elwood W. Heinbach, manager of the Refectory, died at the wheel of his car last Tuesday morning at about 10 o'clock in Lower Gwynedd Township. Mr. Heinbach was 48 years old.

Mr. Heinbach was returning from Lewisburg. He had taken his mother back to a home for the aged, where she is a resident. Sargent John Smart of the Lower Gwynedd police said that Mr. Heinbach evidently died of a heart attack. The car veered off Welsh Road, continued over the lawn of a home near the intersection of Tennis Avenue and Welsh Road, and came to a stop. No other car was involved, and Mr. Heir- ... bach's car did not strike anything.

Sargent Smart said that he identified the man from cards in his pockets, and that he found literature on the care of heart conditions and heart medicine in the car.

#### FUNERAL HELD ON SATURDAY

Funeral services for Mr. Heinbach were held Saturday in Mifflinburg. Burial was in a burial plot also in the Mifflinburg area.

#### MEMORIAL SERVICE PLANNED

A memorial service for Mr. Heinbach will be held in the Seminary Chapel on Tuesday, January 5, at 7:30 p.m. Rev. Robert E. Neumeyer will officiate at the service. The Heinbach's became familiar in. him several years ago when he was in Williamsport. Since then, they have made it a point to attend Christmas eve service wherever Pastor Neumeyer is preaching. Pastor Neumeyer said that just a couple of days before the accident, Mr. Heinbach

called him to find out where he would be preaching this year. Since Pastor Neumeyer was not preaching this year, arrangements were made that the Heinbach's would attend church with Pastor Neumeyer, wherever he went.

### BACKGROUND ON MR. HEINBACH

Mr. Heinbach began working for Slater Food Service in 1956, when he was working in food service at the Berkshire Knitting Mills in Reading, Pa. He worked there until 1960, when he became chef here at the Seminary. In September of 1961, he became the chef-manager of the Refectory. During his surners, Mr. Heinbach was chef-manager at the Pennington Island Camp. Prior to working at the Berkshire Mills, he worked in food service at the Reading Hospital and the Washington Hotel in Reading.
