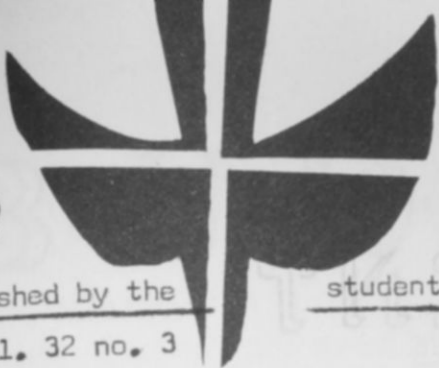

# PRESIDENT

Next Wednesday, September 30th, during the convocation hour there will be a Student Body meeting in the chapel. At this meeting the budget will be proposed for approval (see budget in this issue), Student Body fees will be set, and nominations will be read for the office of Vice President, and Secretary of the Student Body. At this time nominations from the floor will also be received. The Vice President is elected from the Senior class and the Secretary is elected from the Junior class.

Voting for these two positions will be conducted during the next five days in the mail room. Each person will receive a ballot with his name on it in his mail box Thursday morning, October 1st. Voting will continue until Tuesday October 6th at 4:30 p.m. After this time no more ballots will be received. There will be a ballot box placed in the mail room and only those ballots placed in this box will count.

A person must receive a majority of the votes cast in order to win the election. In the event that no one candidate receives a majority a run off election between the two candidates with the highest number of votes will be held. Election results will be announced in the October 7 issue of the Seminarian.

## BIG BROTHER NEEDED

Opportunities are now available for a limited number of Seminarians who would like to volunteer to be a "Big Brother" to one of the children at the Lutheran Home. You must be able to be there on a regular basis.

## SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL SHERIFF

All parking spaces on the main driveway beside the refectory and behind Graduate Hall with the exception of spaces 116-127 have been assigned. Commuting students are not assigned parking spaces but may use spaces 116-127 behind Graduate Hall. When these spaces are already occupied, commuters must park on the street.

The following rules will be enforced in order to keep parking problems to a minimum:

- I. Between 7:00 A.M. Monday and 5:00 P.M. Friday the only students' cars permitted to park on the campus parking lots are those assigned to specific spaces, and each car must be parked only in its assigned space. The following exceptions are permitted:
  1. Commuters may use spaces 116-127 on the Graduate Hall lot, except on Thursdays, when they must be left vacant for the Graduate School.
  2. An unassigned car may be parked in a numbered space with the permission of the student assigned to that space and of the sheriff, or with the permission of the sheriff in the absence of the person assigned to the space.
  3. If an unauthorized car is parked in a student's assigned space, the student may park in a "visitor's" space, but should notify the sheriff and move as soon as his space is vacated.
- II. The following system of fines will be used in order to enforce the above regulations:
  1. 1st Warning
  2. 2nd Warning
  3. Fine of \$1.00
  4. Fine of \$5.00
  5. Prohibition of operating and/or parking a motor vehicle on campus for the remainder of the academic year.

Here it is folks the answers to last weeks Play Games.

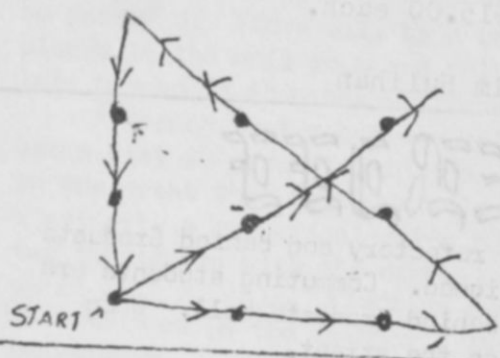
Arrange 10 trees in 5 rows with 4 trees in each row.
