om The Truth of The

Great Mumpkin

There has been much contemptible discussion lately on the matter as to whether or not the Great Pumpkin exists, and what His relationship is to the realm of creation. CPE

A few guiding principles relative to CPE reports have been agreed to by a committee involving students, faculty, and synod presidents.

The committee is concerned to protect the confidentiality of the CPE reports, since those reports were written for a very selected audience (the student and a qualified seminary representative) about a very particular experience. Consequently, it is agreed that no synodical representatives will receive from the seminary a student's CPE report until both the student and the CPE supervisor have given written consent. This principle will be applied prospectively and not retroactively. Concretely, this means that after September, 1970, "all subsequent intern and CPE reports are to be collected with the common understanding that they will subsequently be shared with the synod presidents alone." The present juniors, therefore, will be asked to sign appropriate releases.

The policy is different for all current seniors, interns, and middlers. The seminary will not send out, and will not be required to send out, their CPE reports. Generally, this means that the synod presidents will receive no evaluation or summary of the student's clinical experience. Please note that there may be exceptions to this rule. The agreement does not prevent a synod president from asking one or all of his students for CPE reports. The seminary hopes that this privilege will not be exercised, but whether or not it is is up to the discretion of each synod president.

If you have any questions, I will be happy to discuss them with you.


