The following letter was received in : response to the editorial in the November 4 issue of the Saminarian. This is a copy of the letter sent to Dr. Perry.

Dear Dr. Perry,

I am embarrassed by the editorial which appeared in the <u>Seminarian</u> this morning and feel constrained to offer another point of view in the hope that it might lighten the negative effect of the editorial on you and all who have and will read it. (Thus I have taken the liberty of sending a copy of this letter to the Seminarian for public dissemination.)

I personally consider Mr. Koons' statement to be vitriolic, vituperative, slanderous, insulting, malicious and diabolic--but I state the obvious. Not all of us, both students and faculty, hold this view of you and your letter.

I personally welcomed your letter. I felt that finally someone was getting out on the table some of the cards everyone has been holding up their sleeves. I saw it as the expressionon your part of an openness that has not always been expressed by students, faculty, board or constituency. As a matter on the table some of the cards everyone me to communicate with you earlier this week when I forwarded to you a copy of some information which was intended only for graduating seniors. I felt that you had opened up new lines of communication which I desired to keep open. My colleague Mr. Koons apparently feels much differently about your letter than I do.

While I condemn the way in which Mr. Koons expressed his opinions, his letter does share. His letter while it is unfair in its overstatement does express a mistrust of you which many have. I feel however this mistrust is due to much misinformation and many myths which have festered on campus. Perhaps the causes of the gulf of distrust which separate us from you are not unlike those which separate us from Gettysburg-misinformation, suspicion, provincialism, and stubbornness.

I am sorry you have unjustly, in my opinion, been made the victim of Mr. Koons' yellow journalism techniques. However, the sentiments he expressed behind the unfortunate words he chose may be helpful in informing you of what you have to work with or against (as the case may be). I hope the effect of Mr Koons' editorial will not alienate you from those of us like myself who desire more constructive exchanges.

Kee, Professor of History Association of Professors of Christian Ethics, the American Academy of Political and Social Science, the American Academy of Religion, the Alumni Council of the Yale Divinity School, and the trustee board of the Andover Newton Theological Seminary. His previous activities include terms on the board of trustees of several schools and colleges, and on a variety of church boards and commissions.

The author of Racism and the Christian Understanding of Man, he has contributed chapters to symposia, and articles to various religious and academic journals.


# VICTORY
