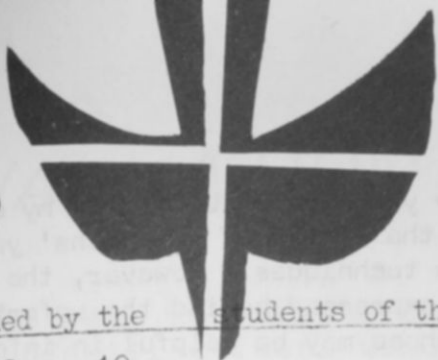

# REPLY

The following letter was received in :  
response to the editorial in the November 4  
issue of the Seminarian. This is a copy of  
the letter sent to Dr. Perry.

Dear Dr. Perry,

I am embarrassed by the editorial which ap-  
peared in the Seminarian this morning and  
feel constrained to offer another point of  
view in the hope that it might lighten the  
negative effect of the editorial on you and  
all who have and will read it. (Thus I  
have taken the liberty of sending a copy of  
this letter to the Seminarian for public  
dissemination.)

I personally consider Mr. Koons' statement  
to be vitriolic, vituperative, slanderous,  
insulting, malicious and diabolic--but I  
state the obvious. Not all of us, both  
students and faculty, hold this view of you  
and your letter.

I personally welcomed your letter. I felt  
that finally someone was getting out on the  
table some of the cards everyone has been  
holding up their sleeves. I saw it as the  
expression on your part of an openness that  
has not always been expressed by students,  
faculty, board or constituency. As a matter  
of fact, it was your letter that prompted  
me to communicate with you earlier this week  
when I forwarded to you a copy of some in-  
formation which was intended only for grad-  
uating seniors. I felt that you had opened  
up new lines of communication which I  
desired to keep open. My colleague Mr.  
Koons apparently feels much differently  
about your letter than I do.

While I condemn the way in which Mr. Koons  
expressed his opinions, his letter does  
reveal some of the negative sentiment toward  
you personally which many of the students  
share. His letter while it is unfair in its  
overstatement does express a mistrust of you  
which many have. I feel however this mis-  
trust is due to much misinformation and  
many myths which have festered on campus.  
Perhaps the causes of the gulf of distrust  
which separate us from you are not unlike  
those which separate us from Gettysburg--  
misinformation, suspicion, provincialism,  
and stubbornness.

I am sorry you have unjustly, in my opinion,  
been made the victim of Mr. Koons' yellow  
journalism techniques. However, the senti-  
ments he expressed behind the unfortunate  
words he chose may be helpful in informing  
you of what you have to work with or against  
(as the case may be). I hope the effect of  
Mr Koons' editorial will not alienate you  
from those of us like myself who desire more  
constructive exchanges.

Charles Feilding, Emeritus Professor of Pastoral Theology, Trinity College Faculty of Divinity, Toronto, Canada - representing the American Association of Theological Schools, and the Middle States Association;

Howard C. Kee, Professor of History of Religion, Bryn Mawr College, Bryn Mawr;

The Rev. Robert E. O'Brien, S. J., Dean, Woodstock College, New York, New York - representing the American Association of Theological Schools, and the Middle States Association;

and working with the team:

Samuel B. Shirk, Director, Bureau of Planning, Pennsylvania Education Department, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

Status of the institution: Recognized Candidate for accreditation. A denominational ( Lutheran Ministerium of Pennsylvania ) theological school offering work at the first and second professional levels ( M. Div., M. A. R., and S. T. M. degrees ). Co - education-

al. No off - campus instruction. Professional accreditation: American Association of Theological Schools. AATS is participating in this evaluation.

Middle States accreditation applies to every part, level, and location of an institution as it exists at the time of the evaluation unless any aspect is excluded by the commission. Commission action is necessary to extend accreditation later to new features.

# CONVOCATION

Dr. George D. Kelsey will be the speaker at the convocation on Wednesday, November 18 at 11:15AM in the Chapel. His topic will be: " A Christian Interpretation of Human Rights. "

Dr. George D. Kelsey is Professor of Christian Ethics in the Theological School and Graduate School of Drew University, Madison, New Jersey.

Dr. Kelsey is a member of the Senior Panel of the Board of the Morris County ( New Jersey ) Urban League, the Committee of Southern Churchmen, the Society of Religion in Higher Education, the Association of Professors of Christian Ethics, the American Academy of Political and Social Science, the American Academy of Religion, the Alumni Council of the Yale Divinity School, and the trustee board of the Andover Newton Theological Seminary. His previous activities include terms on the board of trustees of several schools and colleges, and on a variety of church boards and commissions.

The author of Racism and the Christian Understanding of Man, he has contributed chapters to symposia, and articles to various religious and academic journals.

# VICTORY PARTY

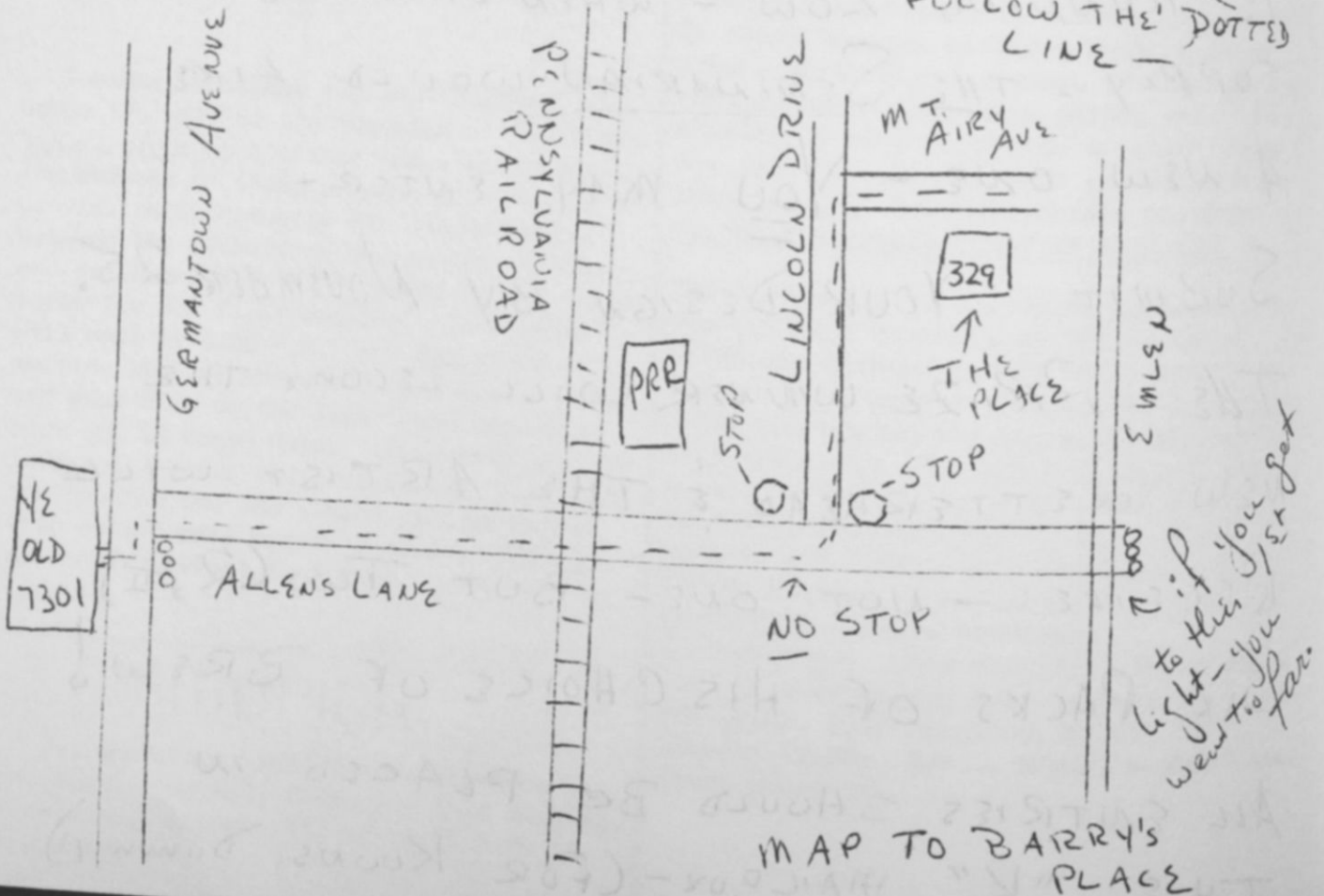
