THE COMET AND GOD'S LOVE

As our astronomer friend was observing the Comet Kohoutek, he thought about what a comet is.

A comet is a member of the solar system. That is, it orbits the sun. The orbit is elliptical as opposed to the more circular revolution of the planets. For this reason, the comet spends most of its life in the distant far reaches of the solar system. But, the gravitational pull of the sun does not allow the comet to completely escape. Eventually the ever present effect of the sun's gravity will return the comet towards the sun, and, as in the case of Kohoutek, this may take some 75,000 years! No matter how hard the comet may try, the sun will not give up on its attempt to pull the comet back.

The astronomer picked up his Bible and turned to the words of the prophet Hosea, who writes in chapter 11:

when Israel was a child I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. The more I called them, the more they went from me.... My people are bent on turning away from me.... How can I give you up O Ephraim!... My heart recoils within me, my compassion grows warm and tender. I will not execute my fierce anger, I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and not man, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come to destroy...and I will return them to their homes, says the Lord.

The message of Hosea reminded the astronomer of the relationship between the sun and the comet. The comet turns away from the sun on its journey. So to, man, in his journey of life, turns away from God. But, as the gravity of the sun returns the comet back to the center of the solar system, God's love for His people is such that He does not "give up"....

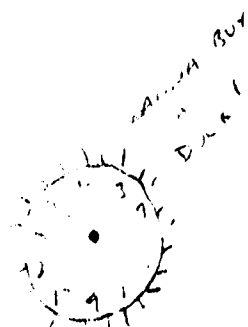
