The Student Body Executive Committee has decided to table the proposed By-laws because of present student concern and time factor. Therefore we will recommend to the President-elect to take seriously the recommended changes in the By-laws proposed by this Executive Committee and to explore further revisions to the By-laws during the next academic year.

CHECKING OUT THE VTR STUDIO

In a series of Sunday night training sessions a number of students have been "checked out" as certified technicians of the new audio-video equiptment funded by a Lutheran Brotherhood Grant received by the Seminary. The studio is now capable of a four camera production with the use of a special effects generator (split-screen, dissolve, fade in and out, superimposing, etc.), production console, and editing facilities. We also have four "Porta-pack" units which can be used for video-taping on location. All this presents a need for people who know what they're doing with this highly sensitive (and expensive!) equipment. A list of these qualified people will appear in The SEMINARIAN so that you will know who to call on when you want to use the VTR studio or equipment. The certified technicians will also be able to train others in order to be "checked out" and certified.

THE VTR STUDIO AND EQUIPMENT IS TO BE USED. This is the purpose of training qualified technicians. Dr. Albert sees the facility instrumental in new learnings for Pastors, congregations, seminarians, and in continuing education. There are presently seven workshops planned for this Spring, Summer, and Fall involving both Pastors and laypersons working with "communication methods" and "developing communication effectiveness". There are also more courses being scheduled into our curriculum which will use the many resources we now have available.

Yes, there's a lot happening down there in the basement of Hagan Center - So don't be surprised the next time you see old H.M.M. out front with his hand extended holding a video camera taking a tape of you!
